

Boating Safety Rules

Driving a boat under the influence of alcohol is prohibited.

Reckless or dangerous operation of a boat is prohibited.

There is a no wake zone in all coves and non-skiing areas.

All boats must have on board a life preserver for each passenger.

Children under 10 years of age must wear a life preserver when in a boat.

All Personal Watercraft operators and Skiers must wear a life preserver.

All boating will be in a counter clockwise direction.

All boats towing skiers must have an observer at least 12 years of age.

All boats and skiers must maintain a distance of 25 feet from stationary craft, 35 feet from shore, and 30 feet from the beach (swimming area).

Persons born after January 1, 1982 need a Boater Safety Certificate to operate a P.W.C.

No skiing behind a P.W.C. unless it is a 3 person jet ski, with a spotter.

Three inch numbers indicating the owner's lot are to be displayed above the water line on both sides of the stern of each boat.

Water Skiing and Personal Watercraft use is not permitted between Sunset and Sunrise.

All boats on the water from sunset to sunrise are required to display proper navigational lighting. All boats not underway, canoes, rowboats, and paddle boards must have a white light visible 360 deg.

Property owners are responsible for the actions of their guests on land and the water. Please make sure they understand these rules.
